SEEDLING SPECIAL - only \$2.50 each!

Assorted species and hybrid seedlings are available at \$2.50 each in 2¼-2½" pot sizes in wholesale quantities of 25 or more. These may take as little as one year to bloom, or may require 2-5 years to bloom depending on the variety. Oak Hill's choice; although we will try to honor reasonable parameters (growing temps, conditions, exclusion of certain genera, etc.)

MOUNTED SPECIAL - only \$10.00 each!

Assorted species and hybrids mounted on cedar shingles are available at \$10.00 each at Oak Hill Gardens' choosing when 20 or more are ordered. Most of our mounted varieties are blooming size. See the "Mounted Plants" page on our website for a listing of what we may include in a "Mounted Special."

If *you* wish to choose the specific mounted plant varieties, mounted plants will cost 25% off of the retail price (i.e. \$11.25 for a \$15.00 retail plant) for an order of 20 or more total mounted plants.
